Friday, March 1st Kramer vs Kramer






The Descendants



BRIEF HISTORY OF THE "GARDEN FOR TRANQUILITY" A WILDLIFE SANCTURARY

In September of 2019, Joanne Gauzens, Virginia Baird, and John Garton met to discuss the feasibility of planning a garden on available property in Clemson Downs. It was to offer animals, birds, butterflies and insects a place of refuge from declining space, as clear cutting was destroying habitat in and around our area. Consultations were made with experts such as landscape architects, entomologists, foresters and birders. Of greatest importance was finally getting IRS to allow donations for the garden as tax deductible contributions (501c3 status)

Finally, after months of pricing and decision making regarding colors of stones, bricks, fountains and trees, the actual; construction of the outlook/patio began. As luck would have it, Covid arrived and the Downs was sealed off from most traffic. Companies could no longer find workers, plant and flower shipments from abroad ceased, and a sad, as well as tragic future, interrupted our project. As we know, we finally progressed as Covid retreated. With fountains bubbling and spring flowers lifting their heads to the sun, Clemson Mayor Robert Halfacre during his dedication said in part: "A garden is always a 'work in progress.'; May this garden continue to grow and provide the benefits anticipated." We feel it has!

We have been fortunate to have many wonderful donors. We have strived to plant bushes and trees native to the area and suitable for a wildlife garden. Due to inclement weather we have lost some plants and flowers, but we do our best to keep everything thriving and healthy. Most rewarding is to see our residents seated in the upper patio watching birds taking a bath, or a deer having a drink of cooling water on a hot day. No garden is ever finished; we are now its keepers and its guardianship is for us to protect.




